Ninety-two percent of 2023 UCAS applicants were accepted onto their first choice of degree course. Queen's University and Ulster University and proved popular destinations for thirty-six students with two students commencing teacher training degrees at St Mary's University College.

Fifteen students have accepted places at Queen's University Belfast with degree choices extending from the MLA Liberal Arts and BSc PPE (Politics, Philosophy and Economics), Sociology, Philosophy, Law and Business Management to the MSc Physics and Astrophysics, BSc Applied Maths and Physics and the MSc Mathematics.

Twenty-two students will attend the University of Ulster. Degree's selected include Law, Art, History with Education, Graphic Design, Criminology, Interactive Media, Environmental Health, and, as with previous years, there was considerable interest in Engineering, Surveying, and Accounting. We are delighted to acknowledge applicant success in gaining places on the highly competitive Paramedic Science, Nursing and Speech and Language therapy degrees where the conditional offer is based on an excellent interview performance.

Since Covid, there has been an increasing trend in students choosing to study in GB. Two of our highest achievers have accepted places to study Mathematics at King's College London. Superb academic success coupled with impressive interview scores enabled two students to commence their medical degrees at Keele University. Six students will become undergraduates at LJMU studying Business, Construction Management, Law, Event Management, Sociology and Psychology. The number studying in Liverpool increases with one student placed on the primary teaching degree at Liverpool Hope and a second student studying Orthoptics at the University of Liverpool.

Leavers have also commenced their undergraduate studies in the following areas: Business at Stirling, Paramedic Science at Swansea, Counselling and psychotherapy at Edge Hill University, and Physiotherapy at Birmingham. One of our creative young film makers achieved an unconditional offer based on his portfolio of work and has accepted a place at Future Works School of Film in Manchester.

Two students are studying a HND Level 5 in Engineering with one at SERC and the other in Belfast Metropolitan College. One student is studying an Extended Diploma in Construction at the SRC whilst another student gained an electrical apprenticeship.

Five students gained Higher Level apprenticeships securing salaried employment in Accounting, Engineering and Computing firms. These salaried positions will enable the apprentice to complete a level 5 qualification on a part-time basis whilst gaining valuable experience. Five students are taking a GAP year involving work and travel before taking up a university place in 2024, whilst four other students are currently in employment.

In St Louis, we recognise every student's contribution and achievements, and we pay tribute to the determination, perseverance, resilience, and maturity of our Year 14 leavers. We wish all former students continued success as they transition into higher education, higher apprenticeships, and employment.
