

St. Louis Celebrating Excellence

In what can only be described as unprecedented circumstances, St Louis students have once again performed exceptionally well despite the disruption to their education over the past fifteen months. The 'Class of 2021' demonstrated great resolve and have emerged with excellent results in their GCSE, AS and A2 examinations.

St. Louis Principal, Kevin Martin, praised the accomplishments of the students and the staff of the school, "I am so proud of all of our students particularly our GCSE, AS and A2 students who demonstrated such resilience and perseverance this year. I am particularly impressed with how well our exam students remained focussed on their studies and engaged so positively with their teachers to achieve such fantastic results." Referencing the challenges posed during the recent lockdown, Mr Martin stated, "Our students adapted very quickly to the use of remote learning and engaged enthusiastically in online live classes, between periods of face-to-face learning at school." He continued, "The marvellous results of our GCSE, AS and A2 students in such times are testament to the work ethos fostered in St. Louis, the dedication of our staff and the excellent support of parents."

The grades were decided by teachers' judgements based on work submitted (mostly examination based) by students towards the conclusion of the academic year in May 2021. Mr Martin was now looking towards the future for the students, "We are delighted that the majority of our Year 14 students were accepted for their university courses and we wish them well as they move on with confidence to the next level in their educational journey." He concluded, "We also have our Y13 students back, along with new students from other establishments who have joined the school, who can choose from the wide range of AS/A2 and BTEC subjects on offer. I wish everyone continued success."

St. Louis Grammar School provides its students with a magnificent platform to go forward and embark on a diverse range of careers. University, college and employment destinations of the recent 'Class of 2021' reflects the unique interests, abilities, talents and aspirations of each individual St Louis student. 91.7 % of 73 UCAS applicants gained a place on a Higher Education Honours Degree Course in August 2021 with two of those students electing to accept offers of a Higher-Level Apprenticeship. 89% of St Louis UCAS applicants were accepted onto their first-choice degree course.
